










· We encourage the children to be independent at all times. It helps them to feel more settled and get on with their day if they are able to do things themselves. · Saying goodbye at the outside door and letting them carry their own bag is of huge benefit to their confidence. Please do not walk them into the classroom. · If you have an urgent message, please let the office know first thing and they will inform us. Mornings are busy and our priority is settling your child. It is important we know if your child has had an unsettled night for example, so we can support them throughout the day.










Our aim is to encourage your child to develop their skills enabling them to become lifelong lovers of reading.

One of the best ways of doing this is by reading or sharing a story with your child every evening, before bedtime. Did you know If a child has been read to daily from the day they are born; by the time they are five, they will have heard (and seen as they get older) around 1,277,500 words? (based on a book containing circa 700 words - such as 'The Gruffalo').










## How do we do

Home Reading Books.


These are changed every Monday, on receipt of the previous week's book. We must ask that the books are returned promptly, making certain that we have enough reading books for all children.

Your child is regularly assessed to ensure that they take the correct reading level book home. These books will be slightly easier and repetitive as they will focus on the graphemes and words from the previous week's phonics sessions - therefore embedding learning and giving opportunities to practise what they have learned.

It is really helpful to remind the children to take their reading books out of their book bags every day and put them in the box in the classroom.







### How do we do

#### this? Reading Road Map Books

These books are chosen by the children, they may not be able to read them. The aim of these books is for them to enjoy a range of genre while being read to at home - why not try spotting punctuation with your child when reading or looking for a particular word / grapheme?

The children are encouraged to work through the 'reading road map' and collect certificates along the way.

#### Reading for fidelity

This may be in the form of a group, in pairs, or individually. Decoding, comprehension, fluency and expression are explored during these focused sessions. These books do not come home.

#### Literacy Tree

Our English scheme centres around a book / text that the children typically explore for 2-3 weeks. They read sections of a text as part of whole class teaching.

# HOMETIME

- •Research shows that there are specific times in a child's day that parent/carer interactions have the most impact on their wellbeing, confidence and self esteem. These include the first five minutes when they wake, when they are greeted by their carer after being parted (nursery / school) and when they are settling to go to bed.
- · With this in mind, We would ask that you
- ·'Greet Your Child with a smile not a mobile.'
