> Homework, Reading, Spelling


Homework is set on a Friday evening and is due back the following Thursday. It is recommended to complete it at the weekend if you can so that it is out of the way and any issues with completing it can be addressed in time. Please note that homework is optional and if it is a source of stress for both you and your child, we would prefer for them to have a happy time at home! However, it is good practise for secondary school and your child will be rewarded with a sticker and housepoint for each piece they complete.

Seesar

Reading should not stop once a child becomes a free reader. If possible, try to find time to share books with your child.

Due to a very wide range of abilities in spelling, all words are personalised to the child and each child has a unique set of words that they are working on. They will be tested in a group once a week and will change a certain number of words based on their score. Children regularly practise in school so there is usually no need to practise at home too, unless the scores are too low to change words - then I will ask for home practise.

Children may take them home if they wish but should be returned to their bag immediately afterwards so that they are always in school.



Rewards and Privileges

We have high expectations for behaviour and learning. Stickers and House Points (Dojos) earn prizes and star badges for excellent work, staying on tasks and being calm and respectful.

Children may volunteer to support younger children in the playground and be sports ambassadors, which helps them to be positive role models to the younger children.

How to support your child

The single biggest help in maths is ensuring times tables recall is fast and fluent. TTRS, online games and repetition is the key to this and help with so many areas of Y5 maths,

Encourage your child to pack their own school bag and begin to take responsibility for what they will need (e.g. swimming kit / reading book)

Encourage them to complete their homework and support them in doing this.

Read with them and to them - but more importantly, talk about the texts with them.

Talk to your child about what we are currently learning about, current affairs and local and global issues. Increasing general knowledge is helpful in so many areas
